What is DreamBIG?



DreamBIG is a **festival** for children and families.

A festival is a special event made up of lots of **activities**.

DreamBIG Performances



There are lots of different **performances** in DreamBIG.



A performance is a show where actors tell a story by pretending to be someone else.

Most performances are in a theatre.



A theatre is a building where the actors perform in front of people who are sitting in seats, watching the performance.



If you would like to come to a DreamBIG performance, you will need to book a ticket on our website.
