Cost

- All workshop events are free for Department for Education educators.
- For the 15 April event at Henley High School, the non-government educator fee is \$25 (half day) or \$50 (full day), as both include catering. Invoicing details will be organised after booking.
- All other workshops are free for non-government educators.
- A half-day TRT backfill is available to regional educators to arrive on time. This request is part of the booking form. Early departures need to be approved by leadership prior to booking. As this is a limited offer, please book promptly to secure this support. You will be notified soon after booking if the TRT backfill has been allocated to you.

Workshop descriptions



The Arts introductory session is suited to all educators.

- You will learn how the new curriculum, adapted from the Australian Curriculum V9, is designed to better support the diverse needs of SA learners. Explore how The Arts curriculum combines knowledge, capabilities and dispositions to create life-long learning and understand how it reflects the purpose of public education in SA.

Dance – Dancing Journey

This workshop suits preschool and primary educators as the learning sequence is written for preschool to year 4.

- The **Dancing Journey** workshop demonstrates how books can be used as stimulus for dance and to support learning about Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples and their Cultures. You will explore ways to create pathways, shapes and levels and develop an understanding of the dance element of 'space'.

Drama – Sliding Moments

This workshop suits primary and secondary educators as the learning sequence is written for years 4 to 10.

- The **Sliding Moments** workshop will have you sliding through time and thinking about what shapes us as people. Get tips for leading activities and using inquiry questions where students devise their own drama by exploring 'sliding door' situations.

Media Arts – Future Me

This workshop suits primary and secondary educators as the learning sequence is written for years 3 to 8.

- In the **Future Me** workshop, you will imagine and create an animation that explores present and future dispositions. The workshop will introduce how to use Stop Motion Studio including the pixilation technique which links to the statewide <u>Pixilation Parade</u> project. Note: Pixilation Parade entries are due 10 April 2025.

Music – Museum of Sounds

This workshop suits primary educators as the learning sequence is written for years 1 to 6.

- The **Museum of Sounds** workshop takes participants on a sonic adventure to experience, play with and create sounds of today, yesterday and the future. You will use voice, body percussion, instruments and technology to collect and curate audible treasures that can be shaped into a composition and shared via a QR code.

Visual Arts – Transforming the Everyday

This workshop suits primary and secondary educators as the learning sequence is written for years 5 to 10.

- In the **Transforming the Everyday** workshop, you will design repurposed versions of everyday objects. You will also explore design features of vintage postcards to send a message to your imagined future self. Note: Student future-self postcards can be submitted to the Collaborative Bunting project by 11 April 2025.
